It has been a difficult period for many of us – we lost a student and a staff member this week.

We shared the news of the passing of Ms Asitandile Zozo, a first year BSc student who passed away tragically. A touching memorial service was held for her yesterday.

We also mourn the passing of Mr Magnath Baijnath, an Operations Manager in the Services Department, who passed away earlier this week after a short illness. He joined the Wits Business School in 2010 and spent much of the last decade serving staff and students on the Management Campus. He was well-known for his meticulous organisational skills, his attention to detail and his management capabilities. He was also responsible for facilities and infrastructure on the campus, for establishing and maintaining operating standards and for ensuring regulatory compliance. He was both a leader and a team player who built meaningful relationships based on trust and integrity with members of the Wits community. Prior to joining Wits, he worked at UNISA for approximately 23 years. He held a BCom degree, a diploma in management development and an MBA qualification.
